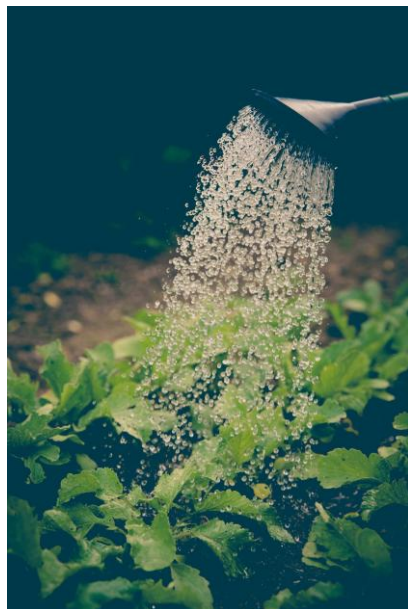

AGRIFOODSKILLS is an Erasmus+ project designed to strengthen the **Agri-food Pact for Skills** by supporting the reskilling and upskilling of the workforce in plant and animal production, food industry, and veterinary activities. Through **innovative training content** – such as *deep tech, AI, future foods, and green and digital skills* – the project equips professionals for the challenges of tomorrow.

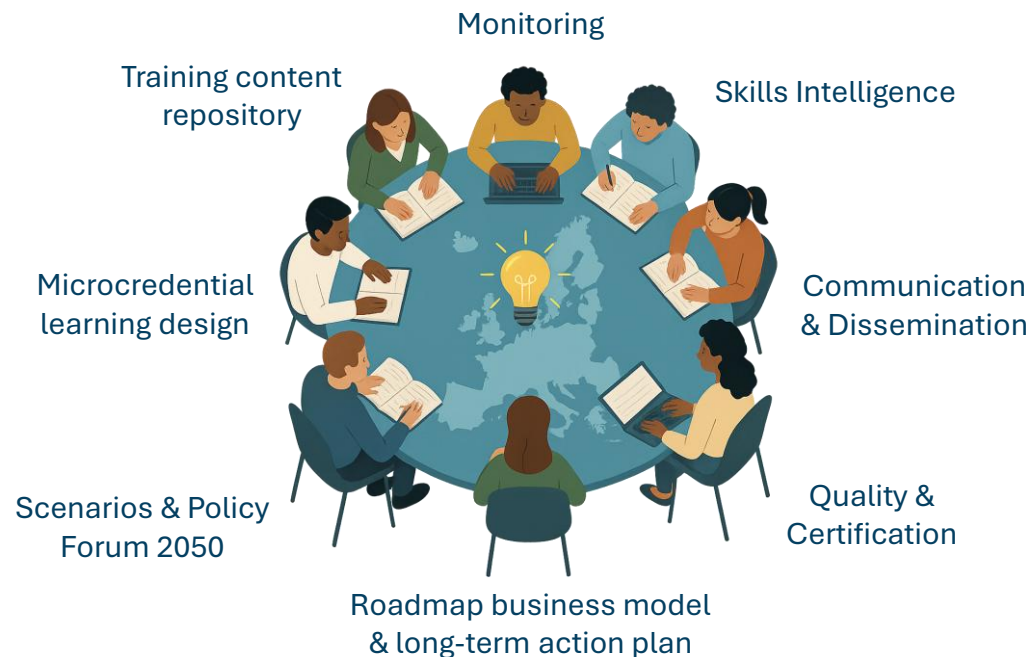
